

Annie came to the Texas A&M University Veterinary Medical Teaching Hospital on a referral from her regular veterinarian. Unable to walk when she arrived, she received a thorough examination and was diagnosed with a neurologic disorder that can be very difficult to treat.

After a discussion of Annie's condition between Texas A&M specialists and her human companions, she began her treatment with the Small Animal Rehabilitation Service in April and walked out of the hospital on her own in July.

Annie was a truly remarkable patient and she inspired many veterinary students and professionals at the College of Veterinary Medicine & Biomedical Sciences. Her determination to walk again helped promote the benefits of veterinary rehabilitation.
