POSITION ANNOUNCEMENT Clinical Assistant Professor – Primary Care

The Department of Small Animal Clinical Sciences, College of Veterinary Medicine & Biomedical Sciences, Texas A&M University invites applications for a clinical track position in small animal primary care. The applicant must hold a DVM or equivalent veterinary degree and must be licensed or eligible for licensure to practice veterinary medicine in Texas. Applicants must have a minimum of 2 years of experience in the general practice of small animal medicine. Certification by the American Board of Veterinary Practitioners is desired or complet a small animal rotating internship.

Primary Care is a required 2-week rotation in wellness, general, and preventive medicine with the goal being to expose senior veterinary students to a practice environment emphasizing high quality medicine in a busy environment. The successful candidate must possess a strong commitment to excellence in patient care, service to clients, and clinical teaching as well as strong leadership and communications skills. The successful candidate will join a team of primary care clinicians and technicians and has the opportunity to interact with over 50 faculty members in the small animal hospital, 35 interns and residents in the other medical and surgical services in the department, and approximately 140 senior veterinary students. The time commitment will be approximately 75% to clinical instruction and patient care in the hospital. Time not assigned to clinical instruction and patient care on clinical rotations will be devoted to classroom / laboratory teaching, scholarship, and academic service.
