
## THE FINISH LINE!

## WRITING IT UP



- Results ONLY show the data you got from the experiment –
  this means showing any tables, charts, or graphs.
- The Conclusion section is where you interpret the results and determine the answer to the question/hypothesis you began with.
- Work on the title and layout of your project last.
- Choose a catchy and interesting title.
- Even if your science experiment 'doesn't work', you will still learn something from it. What did you do wrong? What could you have done differently?

## DISPLAY TIPS

- Organize your backboard in a logical order with clearly labeled sections.
- The following sections must be included in your project:
  Purpose, Hypothesis/Question, Research/Background,
  Experimentation/Results, and Conclusion.
