The Department of Large Animal Clinical Sciences, College of Veterinary Medicine & Biomedical Sciences, Texas A&M University invites applications for an 11 month Clinical Track Assistant Professor position in Emergency Management. The successful applicant will have shared responsibility for the Community Connections 4th-year clinical rotation. Applicants should have experience with individual and population level animal care, local and state-level emergency planning, animal related emergency response, and teaching. Applicants must have a DVM or equivalent degree from an AVMA accredited veterinary college and eligible for regular or special licensure in the State of Texas.

The required Community Connections rotation is focused on emergency management and shelter medicine. This position is focused on assisting with teaching the emergency management portions of the rotation. The mission of the emergency management section of the rotation is to prepare students to take leadership roles in animal related emergency management at the local, state, or federal levels and to participate in emergency response deployments of the Texas A&M Veterinary Emergency Team. Essential duties of the position include supervision of DVM students in daily rotation activities, advancing local level animal-focused tactical plans, provision of veterinary medical care when deployed with the Texas A&M Veterinary Emergency Team, and representation of the VET at the state-level of emergency management through intermittent assignment to the State Operations Center in Austin, Texas. The successful applicant will represent Texas A&M University College of Veterinary Medicine and Biomedical Sciences and the Texas A&M Veterinary Emergency Team by providing excellent teaching, patient care during deployments and emergency planning assistance.

The successful candidate will substantially contribute to instruction, emergency planning, and patient care duties of the Texas A&M Veterinary Emergency Team. Clinical and teaching responsibilities will be shared with the Instructor team for the rotation and veterinary members of the Texas A&M Veterinary Emergency Team when on deployments. The successful candidate will provide assistance for development and implementation of this required clinical rotation and participate in techniques and concepts that will enhance the quality and scope of the emergency management programs of the College of Veterinary Medicine at Texas A&M University. The successful candidate will also work collaboratively with state-level partners in the State of Texas Emergency Management programs including the Texas Division of Emergency Management, Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Agency, and the Texas Animal Health Commission.

Numerous opportunities for scholarly collaboration in emergency management, animal welfare, and teaching pedagogy exist throughout the Department, College, and University. The successful candidate will join a team of 2 full-time faculty, and 2 full-time staff members, and approximately 100 part-time members within the Veterinary Emergency Team.
