

## Juan Carlos Robles Emanuelli Teaching Award

### I. Purpose

The purpose of this award is to honor outstanding early career faculty members of the School of Veterinary Medicine & Biomedical Sciences (VMBS) for their excellent teaching abilities, exemplary use of technology, and enthusiasm for student-centered learning.

### II. Eligibility

All VMBS faculty members at the rank of Assistant Professor who have been involved in the teaching and education of veterinary students, undergraduate and graduate students, interns, and residents in VMBS are eligible. Recipients of the award shall be ineligible for reconsideration.

### III. Nomination and Selection

Any faculty member who meets the eligibility criteria may be nominated by a student, fellow faculty member, Department Head, or Assistant/Associate Dean. **Self-nominations will also be accepted.**

The nomination should not exceed 2 pages and it should include a summary of the nominee's teaching assignments, and a narrative explaining the evidence for effective use of technology in teaching, excellent teaching skills, and enthusiasm for student-centered learning.

An ad hoc faculty committee will screen the nominations and recommend up to 3 nominees to the School's Executive Committee for final selection and approval.

If no nominations are received, or if none of the nominees are determined to be worthy of the award, no award will be presented.

### IV. Award

One or two awards will be presented each year. The award will be presented at the annual VMBS Honors & Awards ceremony and it will consist of a certificate and a check for \$500.
